



# The Fool's Journey Through the Alchemical Unfoldment ... An Intermediate/Advanced Tarot Workshop

*A four-part instructional series meeting one Saturday per month. This workshop is designed for Readers who possess a working knowledge of the Cards, and who are open to a process-oriented, archetypal/alchemical approach that is conducive to spiritual practice.*

**S**tudying five or six Major Arcana Cards per session, we will work with the concept of an "alchemical unfoldment," which charts and embraces life's cyclical ups and downs, viewing both the splendor of the mountaintop and the blackness of the ocean depths as equally-precious repositories of wisdom. As we follow The Fool along the Path symbolized by successive Major Arcana Cards, we will pay special attention to the alchemical "sine-wave" nature of soul-unfoldment, which always revolves around a single, dominant archetype. Participants will be encouraged to offer personal insights into a given Card's meaning, drawing on his or her own life's experiences as reflected in Tarot artwork. This workshop will be interactive, so that all participants have an opportunity to learn from one another.
